Title: Holistic well-being through Yoga

Objective - Expanding insight through Yoga, building a healthy and powerful society through Yoga, eliminating contradictions, obstacles and resistances through Yoga is an important objective of this practice. Yoga connects us with that consciousness which makes us realize the oneness of all living beings. Yoga practice is very beneficial and healthy to remain stress-free and maintain efficiency and consistency in the current daily lifestyle. Also, its purpose is to move from karma to karma yoga. Through Yoga, Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam, the purpose of one earth, one family and one future is to be realized.

Context: SSU has been a centre of Indian knowledge tradition since 1791. And Yogatantra is established here as a department under which yoga is already being taught. Also, regular yoga practice has been conducted by Dr. Rajkumar Mishra since 2005. And after the untiring efforts of Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi ji, after organizing International Yoga Day and motivating all the state universities to promote yoga globally and Hon'ble Chancellor and Governor of Uttar Pradesh Smt. Anandiben Patel ji, regular practice in the university has also gained momentum.

7.3 - Institutional Distinctiveness

7.3.1 - Highlight the performance of the institution in an area distinct to its priority and thrust

The antiquity of the University is another uniqueness of this institution. SSU has been steadfastly committed since 1791 in guiding the society by continuous preservation, promotion, study, teaching and character development of the knowledge tradition of the Indian Sanatan. It has been replaced as a university with effect from 22 March 1958. There are more than 600 affiliatedcolleges all over India, which shows the vastness of this university. The study of ancient Rajshastrastra and Tantragama subjects is taught only in Sampurnanand Sanskrit University. Sampurnanand Sanskrit University has the world's finest manuscript collection, the Saraswati Bhawan Library, which has a collection of about one lakh manuscripts. Script based description - Most manuscripts exist in ancient Nagari, present day Devanagari. Other scripts include Bengali, Oriya, Maithili, Gurmukhi, Sharda, Arabic, Persian and Burmese scripts.

Most of the manuscripts are on paper. Lipyasana is also present on bhoj leaf, wood leaf, palm leaf, gold leaf, litho (rock leaf). There are 14 volumes, in total 36 parts. A nearly 1000-year-old manuscript on handmade paper is available at Shrimad Bhagwat Saraswati Bhawan, which is probably the oldest paper-based manuscript in the country. The Kamwacha Burmese script on the Lakshapatra covered with gold leaf is stored here. The Raspanchadhyayi illustrated is golden and has a subtle artistry unparalleled. The Rigvedasamhita Bhashya by Govind Bhatta is older than the Rigveda Samhitabhashya by Shrutivikasa Sayanacharya. There is a large collection of many other distinguished manuscripts. In addition to this university has Vag Devi Temple, Yajanshalaya and a Musuem in its premises.
